(Course #14) 2 day How to Communicate Bad News Workshop

This 2 day workshop is designed prepare the attendees for the unpleasant job of delivering bad news and includes the following:

- How to help yourself and others
- What to do before you get there
- What to say and do once you get there
- What not to say or do
- Now that you've told them
- Breaking bad news by phone
- Some tips for managers
- Serious stress signs

- Suicide risk assessment
- Role plays to give the participants real life experience

Tactical, Weapons, Explosive and Sniper Courses

All tactical courses are taught by former military and law-enforcement special operations operators. Their identities are classified, their resumes will be provided when NIA deem necessary.

Douglas W. McDonald, J.D., the founder of NIA has an extensive background as an operator in both military and police special operations. Mr. McDonald supervises all special operation courses.

- All courses require students to provide their ammo and equipment necessary to complete each course. Course fee does not include ammo and equip.
- Explosives and special equipment will require law-enforcement or military assistance to acquire material necessary.

Number of instructors necessary as follows:

- Classroom instruction, 1 instructor
- Range and field operations require 2 instructors for the initial 15 students.
- 1 additional instructor for each 15 additional students.

Range and field requirements will be provide per requirements for each course.

(Course #15) Introduction to Police Sniping / 40 training hours (5 days)

This school teaches the fundamentals of scoped rifle marksmanship, mechanics of the weapon and scope systems, ballistics, positional shooting, and introduces students to police sniper tactics.

It is an excellent preparatory course for students with little long rifle background who intend on attending a more rigorous basic sniper school, and for command officers who lack the background, but want to learn more about police sniping in an abbreviated time frame and in a non-stressful school environment.

Equipment requirements: Quality scoped sniper rifle w/sling, 250 rounds of ammunition, all SWAT/sniper oriented operational gear is required for this school including duty belt w/pistol, hearing and wrap around eye protection, and personal body armor.

(Course #16) Basic Police Sniper School / 40 training hours (5 days)

This school lays a solid educational and practical foundation for the new or veteran sniper looking to get back to the basics. In five days we try to cover all the basics a sniper could encounter on their first callout as if it were scheduled to happen on Friday after graduation.

The focus of this school is on operational tactics such as field-craft, observation, reporting, range estimation, urban tactics, and marksmanship skills with emphasis on the cold bore shot. Other areas of instruction include policy and equipment recommendations, the mechanics of the rifle and scope, ballistics, the data book, hostage rescue engagements, intermediate barriers, night fire, positional shooting, and moving targets.

All graduates will have demonstrated proficiency at ranges of 10 to 200 yards.

Equipment Requirements: Sniper rifle (recommend .308 / 7.62) with quality scope, sling, carrying case (recommend pelican type case and drag bag), and binoculars. 600 rounds of match grade ammunition, cleaning equipment to include a one piece rod, jags, solvent, and oil. Data book, 2 sets of BDU's w / boonie cap, camouflage gear and paint, cold/wet weather gear, flashlight w/red lens, duty belt, communications gear, hearing & eye protection, sun screen, insect repellent, glove for weak hand, lunch, dinner and plenty of water for each day.

Subjects include:

- Sniper equipment
- Camouflage
- Marksmanship principles
- Ballistics
- Shooting positions
- Shooting through glass
- Cold barrel shooting
- Stalking and hides
- Range determination
- Range cards & documentation
- Reporting information
- Legal concerns & liability

(Course #17) Advanced Sniper Workshop / 50 training hours (5 days)

This school is designed as a continuing education & training event for snipers that have already attended a basic police sniper school.

All students receive a certificate of training and class ranking as many events will be conducted for score. The focus of this training is a review on intermediate barriers, positional shooting, moving targets, and night fire engagements that culminate in numerous scenarios testing the snipers observation and reporting capability, judgment, and cold bore accuracy.

It is recommended that agencies send snipers in pairs to gain the best training affect.

Equipment Requirements 400 rounds of ammunition and all operational gear are required for this school.

Subjects include:

- Advanced stalking techniques
- Hide techniques in urban areas
- Unknown distance shooting
- Shooting slope
- Hostage Recovery Shooting
- Emergency Re-Camouflage Techniques
- Urban hide construction
- Shooting through urban mediums

(Course #18) Vehicle Assault Tactics / 32 training hours (4 days)

This is a fast paced course on both deliberate and emergency assault techniques on both moving and stationary vehicles which are contained by department assets. Stopping techniques for moving vehicles are covered in the classroom and on the range with live fire scenarios included in all phases of training.

Subjects include:

- Planning
- Sedans
- Hostage handling
- Vans Buses
- Special munitions
- Escort / PSD

(Course #19) Vehicle Counter Ambush / 32 training hours (4 days)

This dynamic course covers survival tactics and techniques that students may take when finding themselves in an ambush situation while in a moving or stationary vehicle.

Subjects include:

- Stationary drills
- Disabled vehicle drills
- Drive through techniques
- Back out drills
- Victim recovery tactics
- Personal preparation

(Course #20) Urban Assault Vehicle Tactics / 50 training hours (5-6 days)

There are numerous urban assault vehicles with varying capabilities. This course of instruction will train the operators and drivers in the ability to use their respective

vehicles to the extent of their capability in resolving urban assault operations in unique crisis situations.

This course covers all aspects of modern warfare and tactical operational use of special vehicles for the support of urban combat and special tactical operations.

Subjects include:

- Single structure assault
- Multiple structure tactics
- Vertical assault techniques
- Pick up drills
- Special team insertion
- Extraction in urban environment

(Course #21) Disabled Vehicle Survival Tactics / 30 training hours (3 days)

If you are moving VIP / Dignitaries or assets by vehicle, and operating in or around GWOT operational areas, sooner or later you will find your vehicle has been disabled and you are now in a survival situation requiring immediate extreme action. This course is the best in the world at making you a survivor and functioning responder.

Subjects include:

- Kill zone survival
- Short range situations
- Vehicle / Personal preparation
- Strong pointing
- Breakout tactics
- Long range situations
- Vehicle crew extraction

(Course #22) Advanced Pistol Marksmanship / 40 training hours (5 days)

This program is a five-day course that teaches advanced pistol marksmanship, which will enhance weapons handling techniques. The course is designed to build confidence through a series of drills and stress events with specific pass/fail standards.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 1500 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection.

Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

Subjects include:

- Principles & fundamentals
- Loading/ unloading/ safe handling
- Tactical reload
- Shooting from behind cover
- Malfunction drills
- Strong hand weak hand shooting
- Target discrimination
- Moving and shooting
- Wounded shooter drills (including reload & malfunction)
- Stress Shooting

(Course #23) Basic Structural Explosive Breaching / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is the starting point for all individuals and teams who may have a need to use explosives to breach structures for the resolution of crisis or hostage events.

Prerequisites: Assigned to an EOD, Military, govt. unit or SWAT breaching cell.

Subjects include:

- Explosive safety
- Explosive theory
- Breaching mathematics & overpressure formulas
- Recognition & handling
- Establishing an SOP
- Charge characteristics & construction
- Door charges
- Window charges
- Placement & live fire drills

(Course #24) Advanced Structural Explosive Breaching /50 training hours (5 days)

This course is for teams that have an explosive breaching capability for explosively breaching doors and windows, as well as an established certified team standard operating procedure for the handling and use of breaching explosives.

Prerequisites: Fully commissioned law enforcement officer, Military or Govt. operator with a basis explosive breaching certificate from a recognized explosive breaching school.

Subjects include:

- Wall breaching
- Through ceiling / floor breaching
- Breaching roofs
- Multiple breaching (gun-porting/entry)
- Emergency breaching techniques
- Breaching metal / steel doors

(Course #25) Advanced SWAT / 50 training hours (5 days)

This course covers tactics and techniques that insure the success of the police tactical team when presented with out of routine situations such as multiple suspects, fortified locations, or a subject with training in combat or martial skills.

Prerequisites: Basic SWAT certification.

Subjects include:

- Immediate action drills

- Vehicle assault
- Introduction to explosive breaching
- CQB techniques
- Emergency reload and malfunction drills
- Downed officer / victim rescue
- Sniper activated entries
- Arrest team tactics
- Special weapon / munitions use

(Course #26) Combat Shotgun / 32 training hours (4 days)

This course covers the police shotgun and the many situational uses that police officers may use this duty weapon.

Subjects include:

- Assembly, disassembly, & maintenance
- Short range engagements
- Long range engagements
- Skip shooting
- Specialty ammunition

(Course #27) Command & Control of Crisis Incidents / 30 training hours (4 days)

This course is designed for police, military and govt. personnel who may find themselves in the command post during a critical incident that requires a unified command or the possibility of tactical team or rescue/recover intervention.

Subjects include:

- Principles of command & control
- Structured response to crisis incidents
- Tactical planning
- Orders / directives
- Command responsibilities
- Managing outside assets
- Facing the media

(Course #28) High-Rise Building Assault Techniques /32 training hours (4 days)

Requirements to employ police, military and govt. tactical teams into high rise buildings is an out of routine tactical operation requiring special training and techniques to support teams that are faced with multiple floors and excessive space that must be cleared and controlled to insure team safety.

Subjects include:

- Planning
- Special team organization
- Support equipment
- Hallway tactics
- Stairway tactics
- Multiple room clearing
- Roof assault techniques
- Elevator shaft techniques
- Utility team support
- Anchor point tactics

(Course #29) High-Risk Warrant Service / 32 training hours (4 days)

High risk warrants present their own unique situation circumstances to the actual warrant service. There are many unknowns as well as changing conditions that impact the safety of the officers and operators involved.

Subjects include:

- Planning
- Pre-warrant actions
- Raid team configuration
- Room clearing & search
- Raids into fortified structures
- Breaching techniques
- Post warrant actions

(Course #30) Technical Surveillance During Tactical Operations / 40 training hours (4 days)

Being able to see what is going on inside from the outside during a crisis incident makes planning and entry team employment safer at both team and officer level. The equipment that supports this capability is needed by all teams responding to a barricade or hostage situation. This course concludes with a dynamic practical exercise using a terrorist-hostage scenario where students extensively use technological equipment and techniques to defeat the threat. Students receive special focus training on operational security, officer safety, and special investigative techniques.

Subjects include:

- Equipment capabilities
- Component(s) assembly
- Care & maintenance
- Support equipment
- Deployment techniques
- Pre-operation deployment
- During operation deployment
- Deployment during rescue and recovery operations
- Special deployment techniques

- Practical on site scenario

(Course #31) Explosive Recognition & Handlers / 24 training hours (3 days)

This course teaches explosive recognition and handling to company grade officers and soldiers.

Subjects include:

- Plastics
- Binary
- Detonating Cords
- Initiators
- Boosters

**(Course #32) IED - Improvised Explosive Device & Terrorist Attacks
24 training hours (3 days)**

This course covers the current TTP's being employed against U.S. forces by insurgents/terrorists, and the tactics and equipment being employed to identify and neutralize these devices. Insurgent tactics and U.S. forces counter-tactics are covered in detail with range demonstrations using live devices.

Subjects include:

- Emplacement techniques and supporting tactics
- Infiltration of teams
- Employment on roadways
- Employment in structures
- Types of IEDs
- Special situation tactics
- Emergency action drills
- Extraction of teams

(Course #33) Urban Raids / 60 training hours (5 days)

This program covers all aspects of urban raids, the planning that ensures success, and the tactics that work against insurgents and terrorists alike. The course covers raid site security, planning, approach and containment, structural breaching, building clearing, interior breaching, clearing choke points, immediate action drills, CQB techniques, interior tactics, weapons employment, and handling of enemy personnel. Immediate action drills to react to unit casualties and unexpected enemy action are a strong point of this instruction.

Subjects include:

- Planning
- Approach & Containment
- Structural Breaching
- Building Clearing
- Interior Breaching
- Clearing Choke Points
- Immediate Action Drills
- CQB Techniques
- Handling Enemy Personnel

(Course #34) Quick Assault & Withdrawal Raids / 60 training hours (5-7 days)

This program teaches the techniques and tactics that ensure Quick Reaction Force (QRF) raids are successful. Dealing with unknown floor plans and breaching requirements make this a one of a kind class.

Subjects include:

- SOP development
- Special training techniques
- Emergency breaching drills

(Course #35) School Shooter (Active Shooter) / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed to provide patrol officers, on-duty SWAT officers, and police management who may be initial responders, with the necessary skills to counter an active shooter incident and/or hostage situation occurring in the confines of a school. This course involves extensive live fire drills at the range followed by scenarios conducted in schools facilities.

(Course #36) Methods of Entry / 32 training hours (4 days)

This course is designed for platoon and company breachers who are responsible for breaching structures in support of urban raids in non-permissive environments.

Subjects include:

- Manual Breaching Techniques
- Hydraulic Breaching
- Shotgun Breaching
- Thermal (BROCO) Breaching
- Quickie Saw Techniques
- Supporting Tactics
- Planning

(Course #37) Hostage Rescue / 50 training hours (5 days)

This course is for the military operator or small unit commander who may be assigned a hostage rescue mission in a permissive or non-permissive environment.

Subjects include:

- Special planning considerations
- Tactical employment of special support equipment
- Multiple team entries
- Special recovery team employment
- Emergency evacuation drills
- Roof assault techniques
- Complete structure interdiction techniques
-

(Course #38) Small Unit Tactics / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the small unit operator conducting high risk entry and movement.

SUT covers close quarter entry, wide room entry, two man towers, aggressive tactical mindset, split man movements, synchronized movement, team communication, tactical breathing, T- hall coverage, vehicle ambush, bus entry, black raid tactics, hostage rescue, man down recovery (MDE), rapid target acknowledgement, True to Life *T2L scenarios, 2-5 man entries, and much more.

One of the most sought after courses anywhere. It has been taught to Tactical Teams, Black Op Units, SWAT, Military, Protection Units and Commando Teams.

SUT is a *three phase course* and full certification will be issued at the completion of the three phases.

Equipment Needed per Phase: Needed: 1000 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection.
Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #39) Combat Pistol Tactics / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the operator using the pistol as a primary defense weapon.

CPT covers combat grip, “Center of Focus”, speed drawing, target acquisition, four tier shooting platform, move and shoot, combat stance, multiple targets, clearing malfunctions, tactical breathing, stress induced shooting, True to life *T2L scenarios, reloading tactics, 360’ awareness and much more.

CPT is a *two phase course* and full certification will be issued upon completion of the two phases.

Equipment Needed per Phase: Needed: 1000 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection.
Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #40) Close Quarter Pistol / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the operator using the pistol as a primary or secondary weapon of defense.

CQP emphasizes the up close and personal range between 1-5 yards. This course covers body angulations, ground recovery, shooting from an unbalanced position, one handed shooting, drive shooting, tactical advancing footwork, non linear movement, adaptive drawing, “Center of Focus”, dominant mindset and extreme stress scenarios applying *T2L .

CQP continues to be taught throughout the globe to Spec Op Units, SWAT, Protection Teams, Military and Commando teams globally. This is a single phase course full certification will be issued upon completion.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 1000 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #41) Force Protection Specialist School / 50 training hours (5 days)

FPS will cover topics including but not limited to Advance, Threat Evaluation, Firearms, Hand to Hand, Vehicular Protection, Maritime Ops, Aircraft Security, Counter Surveillance, Explosive Detection, Principal Evacuation Tactics, Principal Protection Tactics and Active Communication. FPS is a demanding and dynamic course. You must be in good physical shape.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 300 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection.

Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #42) Survival Pistol Tactics / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the operator using the pistol as a primary or secondary defense weapon and is injured or under severe stress.

SPT covers tactical recovery techniques including, one hand clearing malfunctions , one hand off balance shooting, tactical cover, high stress shooting, “center of focus”, tactical breathing, roll and cover, last stand shooting, opposite hand drawing, gun recovery, one hand reloading and much more.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 800 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #43) Close Quarter Entry / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the operator entering a high risk confined structure with 2-5 man teams.

CQE covers dominant mindset, penetration flood tactics, shallow tactics, two man towers, area of responsibility, team communication, room concepts, rapid target acquisition, shoot no shoot, man down recovery elements and much more.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 1000 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #44) Maritime Force Protection / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the Protection Operative conducting a protective operation in a maritime environment.

MFP covers vessel high risk entry, confined space clearing, dominant boarding, adaptive balancing, man overboard recovery, tactical diving evacuation, hostile neutralization tactics, adaptive halo tactics, compass direction, emergency protocol and much more.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 500 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection.

Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #45) Assault Rifle Tactics / 50 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the operator using an AR15, M4, AK47 and M16 Assault Rifle as a primary weapon.

ART will cover rifle nomenclature, zeroing battle sight, four tier platform, multiple target shooting, rifle stealth movement, tactical positioning, reference check, clearing malfunctions, tactical breathing, “center of focus”, rapid fire tactics and much more .

Equipment Needed: Needed: 1500 rounds of rifle & 400 rounds pistol ammo, secondary pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 rifle & 2 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #46) Fundamental Force Protection / 30 training hours (4 days)

This course is designed for the force protection operative/executive protection agent.

FFP covers protection formations, principal evacuation, blanket tactics, threat assessment, team communication, halo, *T2L scenarios, entering and exiting vehicles, positional awareness and much more.

This course continues to be taught to Dignitary protection Units throughout the globe.

Certification issued upon completion.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 300 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #47) Force Protection Tactics / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the active or prospective Force Protection Operative, focusing on the physical protection, formations and communications of a protective operation.

FPT is modeled after the Executive Defense Agency "Iron Clad" course. This course has been taught to multiple High Risk Dignitary Protection Teams currently operating in Saudi Arabia, Colombia and Israel.

FPT covers, Diamond Angles, MDE Man Down Evacuation, Hover Cover, Distance and Timing, Team Communication, Mobile/Static Wedges, Hostile Neutralization, Hostile Engagement/Release, 2,4,6,8 man structure, active vs. static protection, Vehicle Shielding Tactics, Principal Shielding Tactics, Force Protection Angles / Mindset, High Risk Transport/Escort, Concealed Weapon Carry Tactics.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 300 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #48) Force Protection Pistol / 30 training hours (4 days)

This course is designed for the force protection operative/executive protection agent.

FPH establishes the link between principal and protection operative. This course modeled after the Executive Defense Agency Course TPC Tactical Protection Carry, covering angles of protection, angles of engagement, cover and engage, evacuation tactics, engagement mindset, “center of focus”, principal hand off, moving multiple targets, shooting from vehicle, vehicular cover tactics and much more.

Equipment Needed: Needed: 400 rounds of pistol ammo, pistol w/ drop leg holster, min. of 4 pistol mags and tactical mag pouches, eye and ear protection. Recommended: Hydration system, sun block.

(Course #49) Hand TO Hand Combat / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed to teach direct and efficient defensive /offensive tactics along with neutralization techniques.

H2H has been taught to Spec Op groups, Law Enforcement, Law Abiding Civilians, Protection Units, Black Op Teams and security personnel.

This course covers low line/ high line attacks, takedowns, choking tactics, positional awareness, red stance, leverage tactics, redirection tactics, immobilization techniques, stop tactics, locks, strikes, verbal projection and much more.

Certification upon completion of the three phases.

(Course #50) Vehicular Protection Tactics / 40 training hours (5 days)

This course is designed for the security specialist assigned to transporting, escort or caravan protection operations.

The most important element of a protection transportation operation is to prevent blindside assaults and ambushes. **VFPT** will teach the specialist how to prevent assaults and ambushes.

The specialist will also be taught tactics how to protect the principal, engage, survive and win if you are in the unfortunate situation of facing a vehicular ambush or assault.

All specialists attending must have firearms experience and comply with all range safety rules. This course continues to be taught to Dignitary Protection Units through the globe.

VFPT will cover vehicle angles and positioning, principal evacuation, blanketing and rolling, multiple target acquisition, shooting from a moving vehicle, climbing to position

of advantage, retreat and follow through, counter barricade tactics, deploy and engage, creating "Holes", multiple vehicle saturation and much more.

(Course# 51) Combat Blade Tactics 24 training hours (3 days)

This course is designed for the operator who carries a folding blade as a self defense weapon.

The tactics and techniques taught in this course are "quick neutralizing tactics" extremely efficient and effective. They will neutralize an imminent threat while placing you in a position of advantage.

CBT is covered in *two phases*; this is the first phase course. **CBT** has been taught to multiple Spec-Ops groups and Law Enforcement throughout the world.
